Preparing for Personal Prophetic Ministry

- **Come with Expectancy:** God loves you and desires to speak encouraging, comforting and edifying words to you. He is a good Father and loves to speak to His children. So, come with expectancy that He will speak to you.
- **Come with an Open Heart:** God has fresh new things He wants to reveal to you. He also desires to confirm things that He already has been speaking to your spirit. Ask Him to prepare your heart to hear and receive all that He has to say to you.
- **Come in a Posture of Rest:** Relax and let the Holy Spirit minister to you through the prayers of the team. Generally, there will be three things happening in the ministry time. First, there may be times of silence where the prayer team is waiting on the Lord. Second, there may be impressions, mental pictures or images, phrases or words spoken to you that a team member believes he/she has heard the Father "speak." Third, there will be prayers for you based upon what the team members believe they have heard the Father say to them for you. There may also be a time when our designated leaders quietly enter the room to assure the team is doing well and may pray for you. Rest in the Lord, He is a gentle and loving Father.
- **Recording your Personal Ministry:** We ask that you bring a device to record your prophetic word.
- **Come Without an Agenda:** Time is limited and the team is trusting the Lord to speak through them concerning your situation. Do not feel pressure to spend time sharing your needs with them. Trust the Lord to speak personally to you. The team is acting in obedience and faith, trusting for the same outcome.
- **Please Be Prompt:** All ministry takes place in the Auditorium. Please access the Auditorium by going through the café and following the signs. Sign-in and be seated until a member of the team comes for you. We will do our best to stay on time and ask for your patience and flexibility. Thank you for letting us minister to YOU!
